



DEPT. 56 PRESENTATION – After a pot luck lunch break, we enjoyed a presentation by Lisa Johnson of Department 56. Her job title has changed since her last presentation, and she is now focusing on major Department 56 retailers and clubs in her region, as opposed to representing multiple lines. The new introductions for 2017 were shared. Of note is the return of collector's value sets. Lisa also provided information about a new display that will be installed at Knott's Berry Farm from April 22-24. Stephen Pepin will be there building a new display. On July 29, Tom Bates will be at Knott's and will be doing a signing. There will also be a special Halloween billboard piece for Knott's advertising the Knott's Scary Farm event. 'The Nightmare Before Christmas' is new this year and it is felt that this will be a very popular and successful series along with 'A Christmas Story' and 'Christmas Vacation'. 'Margaritaville' is a new series that is expected to be a display that can be enjoyed year-round. This is also the 30th anniversary of 'Christmas in the City' and it will be marked with a special release of Kringle & Sons Boutique, a numbered, limited edition release. There are many new pieces for all villages and new accessories, including a new gold and silver Twinkle Light Tree. Lisa also noted that all three male artists and corporate executives will be attending the upcoming Gathering in Tempe, AZ.














WOW! THE CLUB RECEIVES A FANTASTIC DONATION

NCC REPORT and Silver Rush Gathering Information

Some thoughts and information from Ms. Lit Town, Melinda Seegers regarding the upcoming NCC Silver Rush – 25th Anniversary Gathering in Tempe June 14-18.

There has been a lot of talk online about belonging to clubs and what fun clubs are. While that is definitely true, it does not mean that folks who choose not to belong to a local collectors' club are any less important to the Department 56 Villages and the community they inspire. That's what makes the Department 56 Facebook page so wonderful—no rules, no secret handshake or membership card, just collecting

fun! And some sharing of ideas!

D56 Platinum Retailers will be receiving two new pieces this year. Maggie's on Park was introduced for Christmas in the City and Lot 59, Christmas Court will be available for The Original Snow Village. If you are unsure of where to buy these two special pieces, visit the D56 website and look for "Platinum Retailers" in the MORE TO LOVE section listed on the bottom of each page. All Platinum retailers are listed along with contact information.

Also two new licensed lit buildings and coordinating accessories will be available exclusively through Sears in 2017. For the Peanuts' Village, there will be Pinecrest Kite Shop and accessory Good Grief featuring Charlie Brown and Snoopy with Charlie's kite stuck in a tree, of course! For Disney's Village we will have a really fun piece,

Mickey's Alarm Clock Shop. A lot of thought and creative design went into this piece with clock parts and gears on the outside, and the shop sign that looks like an old fashioned alarm clock. If you do not have a Sears in your area, you'll have to wait a year.

Some Gathering Highlights: Michael Griffith, Executive Vice President of Enesco - Department 56 Villages, will be on hand for the weekend and will say a few words to the group on Friday morning at the opening ceremony. Right after the opening ceremonies the NCC will sponsor a panel featuring the three Village artists (Scott Enter, Tom Bates & Paul Lundberg) where you can ask questions and maybe get a sneak preview of things to come.

At the June 3rd meeting, we will be introducing a new game called "Name This Addict". You will be told something about one of the members of the club and you must name the addict.

We have also been offered a walking tour of Solvang or a cooking demonstration by a chef who will demonstrate how they make their

great pastries. Please indicate on the sign-up sheet if you are interested in either of those activities.

The cost is \$30 per person for club members and \$40 per person for non-members. Water and snacks will be provided on the coach and there will be a couple of surprises such as door prizes!

There will be a sign-up sheet at the June 3rd meeting. If you cannot attend the meeting and would like to go on the trip, please email Alita or Marvella. Deadline for signing up and making payment for the trip is August 5.

The lunch in Solvang is no-host and there are over 40 restaurants to choose from to enjoy a delicious meal.

Named by Sunset Magazine as one of the "10 Most Beautiful Small Towns in the Western United States", Solvang's rich heritage dates back to 1911 when adventurous Danish-Americans traversed the plains from lowa, to establish a settlement in the Golden State of California.
